

# Application for Non-Resident Authorization to Transport (ATT) Information Sheet

## Before you start...

Authorizations to Transport can not be issued for the purpose of protection of life while in Canada.

Prohibited firearms will not be allowed into Canada under any circumstances. Additional information on Prohibited firearms available on our website at

The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has the final authority to decide if a firearm can enter Canada.

There is a maximum number of ten (10) cartridges for most handgun magazines.

All non-residents who do not hold a valid Canadian Firearms Licence and a valid Canadian firearm registration certificate in the case of a restricted firearm must complete a Non-Resident Declaration. The requirement to obtain an ATT applies only to restricted firearms. Non-Residents who are transporting only non-restricted firearms do not require an ATT.

### This form is for use by non-residents:

- who are 18 years of age or older
- who are moving to Canada
- who are transiting **directly** from a Canadian port of entry to a Canadian port of exit/United States port of entry
- who are Target Shooting or attending a Target Shooting Competition in Canada

Please allow for 5 to 10 business days for processing. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that enough processing time has been provided for the issuance of an ATT.

Non-Residents transiting firearms through Canada must follow the Storage, Display, Transportation and Handling of Firearms by Individuals Regulations of the *Firearms Act*. All parts or fields annotated by an asterix (\*) must be completed in full. Failure to do so may result in the delay or rejection of your application. (A 'Nil' response may be used when no information is available for the required box.)

# Application for Non-Resident Authorization to Transport (ATT) - Information Sheet

The following definitions may help you complete this application:

## A non-restricted firearm is:

- an ordinary rifle, shotgun or combination gun that is not described below as being restricted or prohibited.

## A restricted firearm is:

- a handgun that is not a prohibited firearm;
- a semi-automatic, centre-fire rifle or shotgun with a barrel length less than 470 mm (18.5 inches) that is not prohibited;
- a rifle or shotgun that can fire when its overall length is reduced by folding, telescoping, or some other means to less than 660 mm (26 inches);
- any firearm prescribed as restricted (including some long guns).

## A prohibited firearm is:

- a handgun with a barrel length of 105 mm (4.1 inches) or less;
- a handgun designed or adapted to discharge 25 or 32 calibre ammunition;
- a rifle or shotgun that has been altered to make it less than 660 mm (26 inches) in overall length;
- a rifle or shotgun that has been altered to make the barrel length less than 457 mm (18 inches) where the overall firearm length is 660 mm (26 inches) or more;
- an automatic firearm and a converted automatic firearm;
- any firearm prescribed as prohibited.

## How to Safely Transport a Firearm

### Non-restricted firearms:

- non-restricted firearms must be unloaded during transportation

### Restricted firearms:

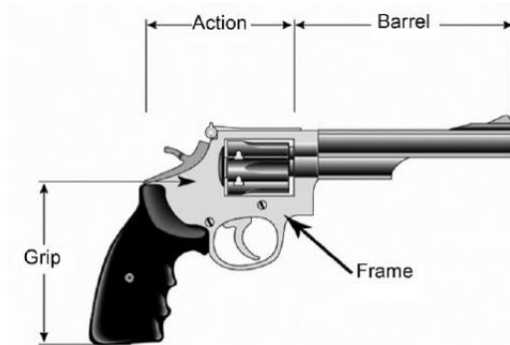
- **unload** the firearms; **and**
- attach **secure locking devices** to the firearms; **and**
- lock the firearms in a sturdy, non-transparent container, **and**
- remove the bolts or bolt carriers from any automatic firearms (if removable)
- obtain an authorization to transport (ATT)

## Border to Border:

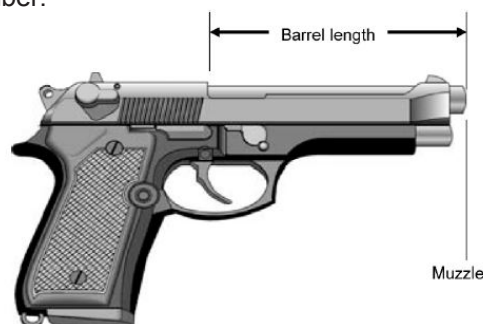
- from a Canadian port of entry to a Canadian port of entry/United States port of exit;
- example: Coutts/Sweetgrass Border Crossing to Beaver Creek Border Crossing.
- transiting through Canada to Alaska from the Contiguous United States (Lower 48 states);
- transiting through Canada to the Contiguous United States (Lower 48 states) from Alaska.

## Barrel length:

- a revolver's barrel length is measured from the muzzle to the breach end immediately in front of the cylinder.



- for firearms other than a revolver, the barrel length is the distance from the muzzle of the barrel to and including the chamber.



## Leaving firearms in an unattended vehicle:

- lock non-restricted firearms and locked containers carrying restricted firearms in the trunk or in a similar lockable compartment.
- if the vehicle does not have a trunk or lockable compartment, put firearms and firearm containers out of sight inside the vehicle and lock the vehicle.
- if you are in a remote wilderness area and cannot lock your non-restricted firearms inside your vehicle, unload them and put them out of sight. Attach a secure locking device to the firearms unless they are needed for predator control.
